

A. Provide the USAO-EDOK and the Denver ORC with a copy of the summons and complaint by email to both USAOKE.ECFCivil@usdoj.gov and OGC.DEN.Service.EDOK@ssa.gov; providing the summons and complaint to the USAO-EDOK and the Denver ORC by email will serve as service on the United States Attorney General as required under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(i)(2). The email shall include the identified information set forth in General Order 16-5.


B. File a Certificate of Electronic Service through the Court's Electronic Case Filing ("ECF") system indicating when the summons, complaint and identifying information were emailed to the USAO-EDOK and the Denver ORC as set forth in subparagraph (A).

(3) Service of summons and complaint under Electronic Service will be considered complete only when both steps in paragraph (2) have been completed.

(4) If a plaintiff chooses to avail himself or herself of Electronic Service and effectuates service in accordance with this General Order, the Commissioner of the Social Security Administration may not raise insufficient service as a defense in any response to a complaint. However, nothing in this General Order shall be deemed to be a waiver of service pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(d).

(5) The email addresses identified are to be used solely for the submission of summons, complaints, and claimant identifying information. They shall not be used for any other purpose. Any improper use is a violation of this Order and subject to sanctions.


