**GENERAL ORDER**

Due to the increase in the criminal caseload resulting from the U.S. Supreme Court's *McGirt* decision, the Federal Public Defender will, on occasion, assign representation of criminal defendants to out-of-district Federal Public Defender offices. When Federal Public Defender attorneys from other districts are assigned to a case, the Clerk of Court is directed to deem them admitted to practice in this District and it will waive the requirement of LCvR 83.2 (applicable to criminal cases per LCrR 1.2) for the filing of a motion to proceed pro hac vice; however, counsel is still required to obtain e-filing privileges through PACER.
